Job Description: Program Director of Kids Meet Christ (KMC)

Time and status: Half-time, non-exempt, beginning February 1, 2025 for a five-year term

Location: Hybrid - Some remote work possible, some in-person work with other WDC staff

Reports to: WDC Associate Conference Minister (Kansas-based)

The WDC Program Director of Kids Meet Christ (KMC) plans and implements the Kids Meet Christ worship and faith formation initiative.

Responsibilities:

- Serve as a member of the WDC staff. Work closely with the Associate Conference Minister (Kansas-based), the KMC Administrative Assistant, and the Resource Library Director to implement the KMC initiative over the 5-year grant period. Participate in decision-making regarding all aspects of the KMC grant-funded program planning and implementation. Participate in monthly staff meetings and other events as determined in consultation with Associate Conference Minister, and at times lead in staff devotions and prayer.
 - a. Plan, implement and invite specialists to lead innovative worship workshops (in English and Spanish) twice a year for pastors and congregational faith formation leaders, to center kids' experience in worship.
- 2. Resource WDC congregations on how to create and implement "praygrounds" in their congregations. Set up model prayground in the WDC Resource Library and for the satellite library in Texas.
- 3. Support the Resource Commission to draft eligibility guidelines for KMC grants for the following:
 - a. Coaching for pastors as they work with their congregations at adaptive leadership to reenvision worship that centers children's experience.
 - b. Consulting by Anabaptist Disability Network (ADNet) for congregations working to effectively include children with special needs in worship
 - c. Worship technology updates for audio and/or video equipment to make worship a more effective experience for kids in the 21st century.
- 4. Support the Resource Commission to draft eligibility guidelines to commission visual worship arts from artists who understand Anabaptist themes and values.
- 5. Help form in-person and virtual support groups for pastors and faith formation congregational leaders who are working at adaptive leadership to re-envision worship that centers children's experience
- 6. Help form social media based groups where any WDC people may share innovative worship ideas that center the experience of children
- 7. Publicize KMC activities in cooperation with the KMC Administrative Assistant and WDC Administrative Assistant.

Qualifications:

- 1. Commitment to WDC's mission, Mennonite Church USA, and Anabaptist values
- 2. Experience as an Anabaptist pastor or congregational faith formation leader
- 3. Willingness to abide by WDC's Safe Sanctuaries Abuse Prevention policy and take training in abuse prevention and response

- 4. Excellent written and oral communication skills. Bilingual ability (Spanish/English) preferred.
- 5. Computer skills, including Zoom, spreadsheets, writing documents, and presentation softwares.
- 6. Willingness to grow in competency in intercultural transformation and undoing racism, and ability to work within the diversity of WDC congregations
- 7. MDiv or MA in Christian formation or equivalent preferred.
